LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN AND PRESIDENT & CEO



The Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC) made dramatic gains in 2006 fueled by our “Tool Box” of donor products:

- Management Agreements for all types of foundations
- Projects for nonprofit and for-profit organizations and individuals to accomplish a charitable mission
- Back Room Services for nonprofit organizations
- Outside Investment Accounts with the donor’s outside Investment Managers
- Split Interest Gifts such as Charitable Remainder Unitrusts and Charitable Lead Trusts
- Nonpermanent Donor Advised Funds
- Scholarship Funds and our partnership with PHEAA’s PATH Program
- Endowment Funds of all types

Due to these varied products, plus the flexibility of The Foundation and the valuable relationships we have with our donors, The Foundation grew by \$15.5 million this year with total assets of \$65 million, as of December 31, 2006.

This substantial growth did not happen overnight. It took time and began years ago when the staff and leaders of The Foundation began planting seeds of philanthropy with potential donors, nonprofit organizations and other groups. The realization of this growth also came from the development of our many new donor tools which was inspired through our partnership, since 2000, with The Greater Kansas City Community Foundation. We are now a Donor-Focused Foundation and are pleased to offer our donors expanded services that will enable them to accomplish effective and informed charitable giving.

Our Community Investment Initiative, completed by the Delta Development Group, revealed to us the strengths and opportunities in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, Perry and Northern York counties. Now we are better equipped to serve our current and potential donors in making informed philanthropic decisions that will make the biggest impact in the five critical areas of need that came out of the Community Investment Initiative - Access to and Availability of Health Care, Transportation to Jobs and Services, Substance Abuse, Job Training/Workforce Development, and Affordable Housing. Another important outcome of the Community Investment Initiative is that The Foundation will move to a proactive grantmaking process that focuses on the five funding initiatives taken from the report. The entire study can be viewed on our website at www.tfec.org.

Eleven years ago, Conrad Siegel and Bill Lehr, both past Foundation chairmen, designed our Total Return Investment Philosophy. This passive investment approach has accomplished what it was designed to do: to give us market performance over time - something that active managers cannot match. We have been able to exceed our benchmarks and rank in the top 5% of all community foundations in the United States. Eleven years of investment performance as of December 31, 2006 shows our all equity fund, Model E, at a 10.5% rate of return,

while the eleven year benchmark was 10.0%. Our Model A, with 70% equity and 30% fixed income, had an eleven year rate of return of 9.2% with the benchmark of 9.3%. Rates of return for the year were very impressive with Model E showing a strong return of 19% with a one year benchmark of 18.4%, while Model A's rate of return was 14.8% with a one year benchmark of 14.5%. We are very grateful for the expertise and wisdom of Connie and Bill and all the members of the Investment Advisory Committee for these outstanding investment results.

Our Regional Foundations, Camp Hill Community Foundation, Dillsburg Area Foundation, Franklin County Foundation, Mechanicsburg Area Foundation, Perry County Community Foundation and The Greater Harrisburg Foundation, have been successful in attracting new funds through the leadership of their Advisory Committees. These committees also work hard to make the appropriate grant decisions to benefit their communities. We look to grow two new regional foundations in adjoining areas in 2007.

The upcoming unveiling of DonorEdge® will enhance the ability of our donors to be more proactive in their philanthropic giving. This web-based program will be available to our donors and the general public and will provide vital information on numerous organizations. Currently there are over 100 nonprofit organizations actively involved with DonorEdge® with another 200 waiting to participate. Our goal is to have all of these organizations join the DonorEdge® network. Participation is completely free to nonprofits and provides them the opportunity to be more visible to donors and the public.

The Whitaker Foundation (TWF) officially closed its doors as a private foundation on June 30, 2006. TFEC is honored to have been chosen to represent them for the next seven years in all business matters. In April 2006, TWF gave a \$3 million dollar gift to TFEC to establish a math and science institute that brings "at risk" middle school grade students to a five week, multi-year summer program held on a local college campus to learn about college life with a focus on math and science skills. We hired the well-known nonprofit group, Project Forward Leap, to facilitate the program. The program also provides year long student mentoring each year through high school


and then assists the students to attend college. There are scholarships for students outside the City of Harrisburg to attend Sci -Tech High School for those students proficient in math and science.

Two board members fulfilled their ten year terms - Harold McInnes and Jonathan Vipond. We hope they will remain involved with The Foundation and sincerely thank them for their invaluable service over the years.



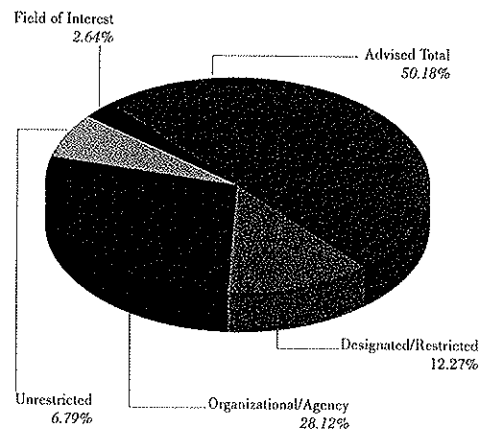

THE 5 MAJOR NEEDS OF OUR REGION

AS DEFINED BY THE COMMUNITY INVESTMENT INITIATIVE:

- Access to and availability of health care
- Transportation to jobs and services
- Substance Abuse
- Job training/workforce development
- Affordable Housing

The Community Investment Initiative (CII), a five-county regional needs assessment, was commissioned by The Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC) in 2005. It was developed by Delta Development Group, in partnership with TFEC's Community Investment Committee and Program Department staff. Financial support for the initiative came from private and corporate donors, as well as the County Commissioners in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon and Perry counties, state representatives and congressmen representing the region.

The benefit of this report is three-fold: to guide TFEC in a proactive restructuring of its discretionary grantmaking to ensure that resources are more directly invested in programs and partnerships that have the potential to positively impact the most critical community issues; to help nonprofit organizations focus their programs and capacity building needs around the key areas identified in the CII report; and

to engage donors to better meet their philanthropic goals by having a clear understanding of current community needs. The CII's strength stems from an exceptionally sound and defensible methodology that was built, tested and implemented by Delta Development Group.

The five critical issues that were identified in the report are, in order of importance: access to and availability of health care, transportation to jobs and services, substance abuse, job training/workforce development, and affordable housing. The Community Investment Final Report was released to the general public in the fall of 2006. With the assistance and expertise of our media partner, *The Patriot-News*, a series entitled "Fix Five" was published in the Sunday edition and four consecutive daily editions of the newspaper.

TFEC will continue to share the message of the CII in 2007 through community presentations and issue-focused public forums, hopefully creating a dynamic "call to action" to improve the quality of life in Central Pennsylvania. The results of the public forums will guide TFEC in the development of targeted Requests for Proposals to fund programs and services that will have a direct and measurable impact on key community needs.

DAUPHIN COUNTY CAPITAL BEGINNINGS



Dauphin County Capital Beginnings has been an engagement arm of the Foundation for Enhancing Communities for little more than one year. In that time span, Capital Beginnings has developed a series of pilot processes that have been applied to urban school settings with very positive results. A SAFE School Community Pilot Program was instituted at Foose Elementary School, in

Harrisburg, PA, to determine the resources that young children would need as they prepared for their future education. The application of this SAFE Program Model, in the Foose Elementary School Community, resulted in the development of a Foose Transition Plan that has been in the implementation stages since the summer of 2006. Exposure to reading and a focus on health issues have been the key driving elements in the Foose Transition Process. Today, talking points are available to help guide any school entity that decides to develop their own individual transition process for their school community. Initial discussions have taken place with administrators in all ten Dauphin County school districts as well as with other engagement partners in the South Central Region of Pennsylvania. Major resources have been leveraged to support these engagement efforts of Capital Beginnings and key partners have been identified to carry out the work.

EXPLANATION OF FUNDS

AGENCY/ORGANIZATIONAL FUND

Nonprofit organizations transfer assets to The Foundation to create an endowment fund. The fund also can accept gifts from other donors. These funds enable nonprofit organizations to protect their endowment monies to meet future needs, to ensure an ongoing source of unrestricted income, and to fulfill their charitable missions in perpetuity.

DESIGNATED/RESTRICTED FUND

Restricted or designated funds provide ongoing support to one or more favored agencies or charitable causes. If a designated charity ceases to exist or no longer fulfills its mission, The Foundation can redirect support in a way that will achieve the donor's original charitable purpose.

DONOR ADVISED FUND – Permanent

This fund offers great flexibility to donors and allows them to be actively involved in the grantmaking process. With the Permanent Donor Advised fund a portion of the income can be spent to meet philanthropic needs while the principal remains invested as endowment. If a designated charity ceases to exist or no longer fulfills its mission, The Foundation can redirect support in a way that will achieve the donor's original charitable purposes.

DONOR ADVISED FUND – Nonpermanent

This fund offers the same flexibility as the Donor Advised Permanent Fund; however, both the income and principal are available to be spent.

FIELD OF INTEREST FUND

This type of fund enables donors to support various areas of importance, such as the environment, arts and culture, or education. The Foundation's Grantmaking Committee then awards grants to related charitable programs.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Donors establish scholarship funds to benefit students at all educational levels. Some donors choose to act as advisors, while others appoint committees to select scholarship recipients. If the donor chooses, The Foundation also can select recipients and manage the entire application and award process. The Foundation is one of 26 partners in the state with PHEAA (Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency). This partnership permits students attending a college or university in PA, who receive a scholarship through The Foundation, to have their award matched dollar for dollar through PHEAA's PATH (Partnerships of Access to Higher Education) program.

UNRESTRICTED FUND

A small percentage of The Foundation's assets reside in unrestricted funds, which the Board of Directors allocates to support critical projects within our service area (Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, and Perry Counties, and the Dillsburg area). Donors establish these permanent funds to ensure that grants will be available for current community needs.

AGENCY/ORGANIZATIONAL FUNDS

Waynesboro Community Concert Association Fund (Franklin County Foundation)

Established on 8/30/2006

The Waynesboro Community Concert Association, a nonprofit organization that has been in existence for seventy years, brings professional entertainment to Waynesboro for a subscription fee. This fund will enable the association to continue its mission of offering the community of Waynesboro high quality entertainment.

DESIGNATED/RESTRICTED FUNDS

Five Senses Garden Fund

Established on 04/14/2006

The purpose of this fund is to enhance, advance, and maintain this jewel, the Five Senses Garden, on Harrisburg's Emerald Necklace, better known as the Capital Area Greenbelt. The sounds of the water cascading over the rocks, the sight of the butterflies flying free, the delightful smells of the flowers and trees combine to create an oasis of beauty and serenity for everyone.

Robert D. and Barbara E. Hanson Fund for the United Way of the Capital Region

Established on 07/31/2006

Mr. Hanson was a former president of the United Way and chairman of the United Way Annual Fund Drive under the leadership of the late Frank Grady. He was active in his service to the United Way up until a few years before his death. He believed in their work to raise funds for health and human service organizations and felt he wanted to provide for them even after his death.

Robert D. and Barbara E. Hanson Fund for the Rotary Club of Harrisburg

Established on 07/31/2006

Mr. Hanson was President of Rotary in 1978-79. He was dedicated to Rotary and actively lived the "Rotary Four Way Test.": "Is it the truth? Is it fair to all concerned? Will it build goodwill and better friendship? Will it be beneficial to all?" He served as an advisor to the leadership of Rotary in an effort to help Rotarians become good leaders. The grateful club established The Robert Hanson Excellence Award, given in his honor, to recognize a Rotarian who gives the most service to the club during the year.

Robert D. and Barbara E. Hanson Fund

Established on 07/31/2006

This restricted fund was established to provide for the favorite charities of both Robert and Barbara Hanson. Both individuals were actively involved in "giving back" to their beloved community through their volunteer work with their favorite charitable groups. They both believed that the charitable organizations they loved were like the children they never had during their lifetime. They wanted to provide for all of them after death in an effort to continue their support that started many years ago.

William and Dora K. Kanarr Fund

This fund has been established from the earnings of the Dora K. Kanarr Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust. It is a restricted fund which will benefit twenty organizations in the Central Pennsylvania area.

This information includes financial and board information, programming and general contact information, and much more—all to supply a donor with a complete idea of how a nonprofit provides their services in the community. With advanced search capabilities, donors can target specific causes or organizations, or even specific geographic areas.

In collaboration with DonorEdge®, donors may also use Advisor Express to make online giving directly from their funds. Donors who have yet to establish a fund with The Foundation, but wish to make a contribution to a participating nonprofit organization, may use the credit card donation function of DonorEdge®.

The participation in DonorEdge® of over 200 nonprofit organizations, in the five-county region, affords donors a tremendous resource of information to make informed decisions about their philanthropic giving. THE WHITAKER FOUNDATION REGIONAL PROGRAM

For seven years The Foundation for Enhancing Communities has administered the regional grant making of the Whitaker Foundation. In 2006 the Whitaker Foundation's doors were permanently closed and selected The Foundation as its administrator. The Whitaker Foundation Regional Program supports nonprofit organizations that provide programs or services related to math and science proficiency.

The Whitaker Foundation awarded The Foundation \$1,000,000 for math and science education. The purpose of this grant is to provide opportunities to students to become proficient in math and science.

The Whitaker Foundation also awarded The Foundation \$3,000,000 for a middle school math, science and technology educational enrichment program for Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry County School District students. The Foundation will administer the grant over a 10 year period. The grant will provide a seven year educational enrichment program to economically disadvantaged students who have shown academic promise. A unique component of this program is the summer institute residential program that allows students to experience living on a college campus.

MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR INDEPENDENT FOUNDATIONS

Through a comprehensive management agreement, The Foundation can essentially perform all internal functions for independent foundations. The foundations retain legal ownership and control of their assets, and they maintain their own governing bodies. The Foundation can be contracted to provide administrative, investment, grantmaking, and transactional services. Within The Foundation's accounting system, each independent foundation can establish separately named funds.

(Note: The Foundation is not chartered as a bank or investment services company, and therefore cannot provide investment services except as part of a comprehensive management agreement.)

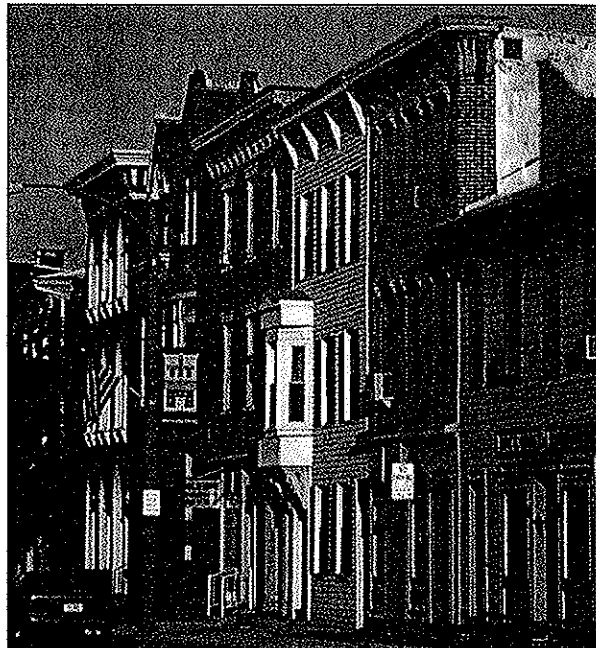
